
Hebrews 5:1-10

Jesus suffers in order to rescue us from eternal suffering

¹ To be sure, every high priest is chosen from the people and is appointed to represent the people in the things pertaining to God, so that he may offer gifts, as well as sacrifices, for sins. ² He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also weak in many ways. ³ And for this reason he is obligated to offer sacrifices for his own sins, just as he does for the people. 4 No one takes this honor on himself, but he is called by God, just as Aaron was. 5 In the same way, Christ did not take the glory of becoming a high priest on himself, but God said to him: You are my Son. Today I have begotten you. ⁶ He also said the same thing in another place: You are a priest forever, like Melchizedek. ⁷ In the days of his flesh, he offered prayers and pleas with loud cries and tears to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence. 8 Although he was the Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered. 9 After he was brought to his goal, he became the source of eternal salvation for everyone who obeys him, ¹⁰ because he was designated by God as a high priest, like Melchizedek.

Mark 10:46-52

Bartimaeus sees Jesus fill his needs

⁴⁶ They came to Jericho. As Jesus and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, a blind man, Bartimaeus the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the road begging. ⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁸ Many told him to be quiet, but he kept shouting all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" ⁴⁹ Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." They called the blind man, saying, "Cheer up! Get up. He is calling you!" ⁵⁰ He tossed aside his outer garment, jumped up, and went to Jesus. ⁵¹ "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him. The blind man replied, "Rabboni, I want to see again." ⁵² Jesus told him, "Go. Your faith has made you well." Immediately he received his sight and began following Jesus on the road.

At this time our offering will be brought forward and presented to the Lord. For those still desiring to give an offering, an offering plate remains near the Usher's Cart at the back of the church.


