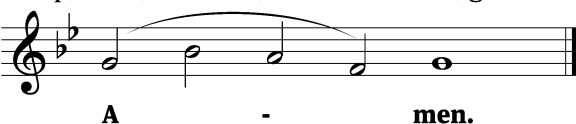

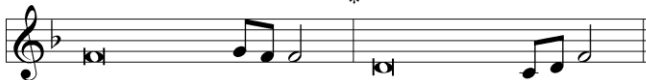

NICENE CREED
